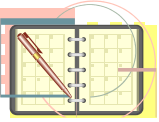
The Inevitability of Turmoil - Part Two

Christians will not enjoy a nice, easy pathway through life. Satan will not have that! Therefore, disciples must persevere through hardship. This prospect should cause everyone pause who is even considering following Christ. The call to discipleship does not promise to ease all difficulties or provide wealth instead of poverty. It promises that whatever we face, it will be worth it in the end. And that is enough. “In this you greatly rejoice, though now for a little while, if need be, you have been grieved by various trials, that the genuineness of your faith, being much more precious than gold that perishes, though it is tested by fire, may be found to praise, honor, and glory at the revelation of Jesus Christ, whom having not seen you love. Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, receiving the end of your faith—the salvation of your souls” (1 Pet. 1:6-9). Jesus did not ascend to heaven by walking a primrose path! He faced constant opposition from Satan, constant temptation, and constant pressure. And yet, despite this, He lived joyfully for God! “Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with

endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God” (Heb. 12:1-2).

Disciples therefore must accept the reality of trials rather than seek to run from them. They have their place, because they make us stronger when we follow God even when it becomes difficult. James wrote, “My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials, knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing” (Jas. 1:2-4). He did not promise that every event in life would be joyful. He did not mean that trials will be fun. Instead, he offers a higher perspective. Disciples can accept trials as part of life and endure trials as they happen in life because they have a greater joy that extends beyond this life. This itself can be liberating, because even in the harshest of circumstances, we can find something positive from which we can grow closer to God. “Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in needs, in persecutions, in distresses, for Christ’s sake. For when I am weak, then I am strong” (2 Cor. 12:10).
